FTAs with EU-US boost India's exports

New Delhi

India's exports grew 6.15% during April-January 2025-26, reaching \$720.76 billion, up from \$679.02 billion last year, says the Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO). Merchandise exports rose 2.2% to \$366.63 billion. January 2026 exports alone jumped to \$80.45 billion from \$71.09 billion in January 2025. FIEO President S.C. Ralhan said Free Trade Agreements with the EU and US will boost market access, improve tariffs, and give exporters more predictability, strengthening India's global trade position.

Delhi HC favors Saregama over Ilayaraja rights

New Delhi

The Delhi High Court granted an ex-parte interim order in favour of Saregama India Limited in a copyright case against composer Ilayaraja. The order stops him from using certain film soundtracks and musical works claimed by the company. Justice Tushar Rao Gedela heard the case, noting that Saregama, earlier "The Gramophone Company of India Limited," had agreements from 1976 to 2001 giving it copyright ownership. Ilayaraja is barred from granting licences or claiming ownership of these works.

Maha Cong chief challenges BJP over Shivaji-Tipu remarks

BJP legislator Narayan Kuche had announced a Rs 2 lakh reward for anyone who would cut Sapkal's tongue

MUMBAI

Maharashtra Congress President Harshwardhan Sapkal on Monday issued a bold challenge to the BJP after comparing Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj with 18th-century Mysuru ruler Tipu Sultan in terms of bravery.

BJP legislator Narayan Kuche had announced a Rs 2 lakh reward for anyone who would cut Sapkal's tongue. Responding, Sapkal said if the BJP proves any historical inaccuracy in his remarks, they were free to cut his tongue.

Sapkal added on X that if his tongue's cutting could



protect farmers from unfair imports, ensure debt-free farming, stop communal hatred, or reclaim territory from China, then "by all means" it could be done. He accused the

BJP of seeking his punishment to hide its constitutional changes and political misdeeds.

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis condemned the comparison as "disrespectful" and "unacceptable," stating Shivaji Maharaj is a revered figure in Maharashtra and India, known for justice and the Maratha Empire. He called Tipu Sultan's legacy controversial, alleging the comparison insulted Maharashtra's people and demanded an apology from Sapkal.

Protests erupted outside Congress Bhavan, where BJP and Congress supporters clashed, leaving nine injured,

including two journalists and two police personnel. Sapkal accused the BJP of "selective outrage" and challenged it to also burn effigies of past leaders like Bhagat Singh Koshiyari and V. D. Savarkar for controversial remarks about Shivaji.

Pune Police registered cross-FIRs: one against Sapkal for "hurting religious sentiments" and others against BJP leaders over the violence. Sapkal reiterated he had clarified his statement and accused the BJP of spreading venom to create trouble, insisting they need no lessons about Shivaji Maharaj from the party.

ED attaches properties in NDPS money case

MUMBAI

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached seven properties, including Mumbai flats, worth about Rs 5.88 crore in an NDPS-linked money laundering case. The properties belong to Faisal Shaikh, Alfiya Shaikh, and others. The probe, based on an NCB complaint, revealed Faisal Shaikh sourced the drug Mephedrone from kingpin Salim Dola. Faisal and Alfiya reportedly ran a network supplying the drug to Samiya Khan, Nasir Yasin Khan, Azim Abu Salim Khan, and others, who then sold it to retail buyers.

Delhi Assembly Privileges Committee sets March 6 as final date for Kejriwal to respond on 'Faansi Ghar'

Delhi Assembly Panel gives Kejriwal a final chance

NEW DELHI

The Delhi Assembly's Committee of Privileges on Monday granted a "final chance" to former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and other Aam Aadmi Party leaders to appear in person and give statements regarding the 'Faansi Ghar' issue on March 6. The panel made this decision after Kejriwal requested a hearing in the first week of March.

Other AAP leaders, including former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, former Speaker Ram Niwas Goel, and former Deputy Speaker Rakhi Birla, also submitted written replies seeking a short extension to record their statements. The Committee considered these requests and scheduled the final date to ensure the inquiry proceeds without further delays.

The matter was originally raised by Delhi Assembly Speaker Vijender Gupta and concerns the authenticity of

Kejriwal to appear before Delhi Assembly Panel

Former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has agreed to appear before the Delhi Assembly's Privileges Committee regarding the authenticity of the "Faansi Ghar" in the first week of March. Kejriwal cited his busy schedule for missing Monday's hearing and requested the Committee to schedule it between March 2 and 6, 2026. He challenged the panel's jurisdiction, saying the matter relates to the dissolved 7th Vidhan Sabha and is not essential for the Assembly's functioning. A hearing on his plea challenging the Committee's authority is scheduled in the High Court on February 21.

the 'Faansi Ghar' inaugurated on August 9, 2022, within the Assembly premises. The Privileges Committee was directed to investigate to assess the facts and procedures surrounding the inauguration.

Committee Chairperson Pradyumn Singh Rajput, along with members Surya Prakash Khatri, Abhay Kumar Verma, Ajay Kumar Mahawar, Satish Upadhyay, Neeraj Basoya, Ravi Kant, Ram Singh Netaji, and Surrender

Kumar, reaffirmed their commitment to transparency, accountability, and institutional integrity.

The panel emphasised that full cooperation from Kejriwal and other concerned individuals is vital for completing a fair and comprehensive inquiry. The final hearing on March 6 will provide the opportunity for all leaders involved to clarify their positions before the Committee submits its findings.


'Gov skipping assembly address not unusual'

SHIMLA

Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Monday said Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla's decision to skip reading the full customary Assembly address "is not an exception." Speaking after the opening day of the Budget Session, Sukhu explained that past governors had also skipped portions of the address.

He clarified that the matter concerns safeguarding Himachal Pradesh's financial entitlements, not seeking aid. "RDG is our right. We are not asking for any charity. Don't harm the rights of the state," Sukhu said. He emphasized that being a hill state, Himachal cannot be compared to larger states in terms of revenue generation, as geographical constraints and limited natural resources reduce its financial capacity.

Sukhu noted that the discontinuation of the Revenue Deficit Grant followed the 16th Finance Commission's recommendations. The state government had called the three-day Assembly session primarily to deliberate on this issue. He urged opposition parties, including the BJP, to rise above party lines and join efforts to seek restoration of

the state's rights from the Centre.

Governor Shukla, during the session, read only a few lines of the customary address and placed the speech on the House table, objecting to references concerning constitutional institutions.

The Revenue Deficit Grant and Himachal Pradesh's financial position are expected to dominate discussions throughout the ongoing Budget Session, with CM Sukhu highlighting that protecting the state's entitlements is crucial for its development and fiscal stability.

Kolagani Srinivas elected mayor of Karimnagar CMC

KARIMNAGAR

BJP's Kolagani Srinivas was on Monday elected as the Mayor of Karimnagar Municipal Corporation. Union Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar and other party leaders congratulated him at the Municipal office following his victory.

The elections were held on February 11 across seven Municipal Corporations and 116 municipalities in Telangana, covering a total of 414 wards in the corporations of Kothagudem, Karimnagar, Mahabubnagar, Mancherial, Nizamabad, Nalgonda, and Ramagundam, along with 2,582 wards in the 116 municipalities.

While the BJP celebrated Srinivas' win in Karimnagar,

the Congress party also claimed victory in several areas. Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, thanked the people of Telangana for supporting Congress, calling the mandate a reflection of "people-first policies rooted in social justice, dignity, and inclusive growth." In an X post, he praised party leaders and workers for their efforts, saying the success strengthens the vision of a "Prajala Telangana" where progress reaches every family.

Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge also expressed satisfaction over the results, thanking grassroots workers and asserting that the mandate reflects the trust of the people.



Akali Dal alleges AAP used govt funds for rally

CHANDIGARH

The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) on Monday accused the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) of using government funds to hold a rally in Moga, urging Punjab Governor Gulab Chand Kataria and the Election Commission of India (ECI) to act. SAD leader Daljit Singh Cheema alleged that AAP linked the event with the government's 'Yudh Nashain Virudh' scheme, but it was effectively an election rally for the 2027 Assembly polls.

Cheema said government money was spent to transport attendees and cover the rally's entire cost, even though AAP National Convener Arvind Kejriwal and Delhi leaders, who have no role in Punjab governance, presided over it. He

described the event as politically motivated, with speeches targeting opponents and making unverified allegations.

The SAD urged the Governor and ECI to recover the expenses, stating the rally violated norms and should not be considered a government function. Cheema also criticised the involvement of the Chief Secretary and Director General of Police, warning it could politicise the bureaucracy. He said forcing officers to attend political rallies threatens democracy and undermines free and fair elections.

The controversy highlights concerns over the misuse of public resources in election campaigning and the potential impact on administrative neutrality ahead of Punjab's upcoming Assembly elections.

TN BJP chief regrets comment on Trisha

CHENNAI

Tamil Nadu BJP chief Nainar Nagendran on Monday expressed regret after his comment about actor Trisha Krishnan drew widespread criticism from political leaders. Speaking in Tirunelveli, he said the remark was unintentional and slipped out while responding to TVK leader Vijay's speech in Salem on February 13. Nagendran added that BJP national women's wing president Vanathi Srinivasan had discussed the matter with him and reiterated, "If my words caused discomfort, I sincerely regret it."

The remark triggered backlash from DMK MPs Thamizhachi Thangapandian, Kanimozhi, and

Congress MP Sudha Ramakrishnan, who called it unacceptable and disrespectful, stressing that personal attacks on women undermine democratic discourse.

Actor Trisha also condemned the comment through her lawyer, calling it "derogatory and inappropriate." She clarified she has no political affiliations and prefers to remain neutral. "Disrespectful behaviour must always be condemned," she said, urging that her name not be dragged into political matters.

Trisha emphasised she wants recognition solely for her professional work and noted that public officials should exercise responsibility and restraint while speaking.

HP Gov skips key Finance Commission address

SHIMLA

Himachal Pradesh Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla on Monday surprised legislators by completing his 50-page customary Budget Session address in just a few minutes, skipping portions related to the 16th Finance Commission. He read only the opening lines covering supplementary demands for 2025-26, the Budget for 2026-27, and other legislative business.

Observers noted the move avoided discussion on the discontinuation of the Revenue Deficit Grant (RDG), a critical issue for hill and small states like Him-

achal Pradesh. Historically, Himachal has consistently received RDG since the first Finance Commission in 1952, which helps fund development projects, welfare schemes, and disaster management. Paragraphs 15 and 16 of the speech, skipped by the Governor, highlighted the adverse impact of RDG discontinuation on Special Category States.

Political analysts said the Governor's brief address sets an "aggressive tone" toward the Opposition BJP, which has criticised the Congress government over alleged fiscal mismanagement and stalled Central-funded projects, including a medical device park.

STRAY RULE

Rajasthan HRC acts after dog bites tourist

JAIPUR

The Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission (RSHRC) on Monday took notice of a stray dog biting an Israeli tourist at Jaipur International Airport's Terminal 2. The victim, arriving from Delhi, was attacked near the arrival gate and left bleeding.

Airport staff provided first aid and rushed her to a private hospital. Reports revealed the same dog had bitten three other people the previous week, yet no action was taken to remove it.

The Commission issued notices to Jaipur Municipal Corporation, Jaipur Police, Deputy Commissioner Sanganer, and Jaipur Airport authorities. It specifically directed the airport manager to



reimburse all medical expenses and provide appropriate compensation to the victim. Chairperson Justice GR Moolchandani said such incidents harm Jaipur's image as an international tourist

destination and contradict the spirit of "Padharo Mhare Desh."

The RSHRC highlighted that stray dog attacks are frequently reported across Rajasthan and emphasized the need for strict ad-

herence to Supreme Court and Rajasthan High Court guidelines on handling dangerous dogs. The Commission said airport authorities, CISF, municipal officials, and district administration are jointly responsible for rescuing aggressive dogs and relocating them to veterinary hospitals or safe shelters.

The case will be reviewed on March 5, 2026, to check compliance with the orders. The Commission stressed that allowing tourists to be attacked by known stray dogs is unacceptable and urged authorities to ensure stricter safety measures at Jaipur Airport to protect visitors and maintain the city's reputation as a global tourism hub.
